

APRIL 14 WEEKLY FISHING REPORT

Lake Nacimiento Report

Spotted Bass and White Bass were the most caught fish this week. White Bass have officially begun to boil in the middle of the coves this week. Best action seems to be in Las Tablas. For White Bass and Spots use top water lures or spinner baits. Crappie bite is picking up as well with crappie jigs, worms, and grubs producing the best results. Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass are being caught in the back of coves and shallow water. Plastic worms and spinner-baits are producing best results. Catfish bite is good in morning and evening, fish shallows using shad, anchovies, or worms.

Lake San Antonio Report

Crappie bites have exploded at San Antonio this week. Several fishermen catching their limits off of kayaks and hand launched vessels. Crappie jigs with meal worms are producing best results. Striper bite is still going strong, jigs, crank baits, and large spinners working best. Largemouth/Smallmouth Bass are being caught near the shallow rocky sections of the lake. Using small spinners, swimbaits, and live shad producing best results. Hot spots include: shoreline near Half Moon Bay, close to the moored Marina, and the shoreline at Three Fingers.

- Carp: 52 pounds (a State record, caught by Lee Bryant in 1968)
