

JUNE 27TH WEEKLY FISHING REPORT

Lake Nacimiento Report

Going into the summer months the Bass bite begins to slow during the afternoons. You can still snag some in the mornings and evenings continuing past sunset. Spotted Bass are still prevalent and White Bass continue to boil. Yesterday a White Bass boil was spotted near the North Shore Launch Ramp (closed for the season) and continued for several minutes. White Bass are being caught all day long, if you come across a boil throw anything small (Rooster tails, small cranks, small top-water) and enjoy the NO LIMIT fishing!

Lake San Antonio Report

Stripers are being caught mostly in the evening with swim baits producing the best results. Largemouth Bass and Catfish are being caught regularly, bass on plastics and creature baits, catfish on cut anchovies, blood bait etc.. These fish are being caught off of Kayaks and other hand launched vessels as well as off the shoreline. Smallmouth Bass are being caught as well, fish the points near Half Moon Bay and the wooded shoreline opposite the moored Marina. We expect Stripers to begin boiling very soon and you will be updated as soon as the season's first boils appear.

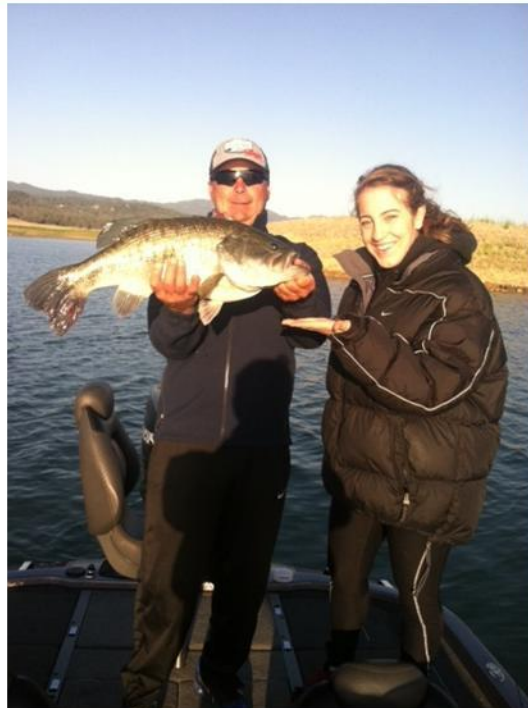

This lunker was caught and released at Lake Nacimiento 2 weeks ago. That means it is still alive and available! 11lbs 14oz Largemouths do exist at Lake Nacimiento!
